March 19, 2025

Chad Ashbaugh, Chairman called the Rushcreek Township Trustee Board meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

#### **BID OPENING**

#### **NOTICE TO BID**

The Rushcreek Township Trustees are accepting sealed bids for approximately 400-500 ton of Cold patch to be milled onsite at 213 Marietta Street, Bremen, OH. Bid must include current BWC certification, proof of insurance and able to sign hold harmless agreement. Bid must be received by 6:30 p.m. March19<sup>th</sup> 2025. Bid opening will be held March 19th, at 7 P.M. at the regular board meeting. Details regarding the bid can be obtained by calling (740) 569-7181 ext. 11. Rushcreek Township Trustees reserve the right to reject any or all bids.

1 bid received from SC Construction Trustee Ashbaugh Motion to accept bid from SC Construction at a rate per ton of \$159.00 to be milled and delivered to 213 Marietta Street and hold harmless agreement to be signed. Discussion: Mr. Conn reviewed the bid with the Board that provided 2 fuel based and 1 water based option for milling. Trustee Ashbaugh asked what option SC Construction recommended.

Mr. Conn stated the option we worked with last year at a rate of \$159.00 per ton was their recommendation again as long as the Township had no issues. Richard commented the product was effective last year. Mr. Conn added that SC Construction does a cold mix for level coating roads in preparation for chip seal as opposed to a hot mix. He believes the cold mix is less rigid than a hot mix and can be applied up to 4". He shared some locations where they have applied cold mix level coat with the Board. Trustees stated they are considering some level coat on the roads this year and would be interested in more information. **Second: Trustee Downard.** Hearing no further comments; Trustee Ashbaugh called the roll.

#### Chairman Ashbaugh asked Visitors to address the Board

Harry Deahl was present to observe, Connie Flemming addressed the Board regarding property they are considering for purchase regarding road frontage and parcel splits. She provided each trustee with a copy of the aerial view of the acreage and the proposed splits for the property. Connie stated she and Jeff had discussed the proposed splits with Fiscal Office. They understand that 175ft. of road frontage is needed or a variance requested for less road frontage and that request along with a fee of \$450 would need to be submitted. Jeff Flemming asked how long that process would take. Dave Foltz from the Zoning Commission confirmed that 30 days from the date of application to the Zoning Board of Appeals. Mr. Riggs and Mr. Bok confirmed some road frontage measurements that had been done. The collective group inquired about shared a shared driveway even though each parcel would have adequate road frontage. They were advised of the ROW requirements and approval of the Road Department and the need to have legal advice on the preparation of a shared drive in the prepared deeds, they Township could not provide language or legal advice. The Board indicated the survey would further details the parcels and the required road frontage. There is a parcel that would need to be purchased from Mr. T

Stover in order to gain some road frontage. Mr. Deahl indicated he would also be selling, deeding or transferring some access in the event they were the purchasers. Mr. Deahl is purchasing adjacent parcel(s). The Board also advised they should discuss proposal with County Health Department in regard to water and septic needs for the parcel splits.

Dave Foltz advised the Board they are setting a public hearing date for final changes to the cemetery language in the Zoning Resolution and the addition of Solar language to our Zoning Resolution. The meeting is set for April 3<sup>rd</sup> at 7p.m. at the Firehouse. Dave

Tent Church Road complaint regarding grindings, Tiffany Morris. Richard spoke with her and gave message to Trustee Ashbaugh as well. Trustee Ashbaugh also spoke with Ms. Morris to let her know grindings have been used on our roads for several years without incident. There are many road hazards that could impact daily driving and maintenance.

#### **Administration**

Trustees' Downard and Ashbaugh met with County Engineer, Jeremiah to look at culvert on Tent Church Road and bid specs. Post meeting the Engineers office did further inspection of the culvert and decided the culvert requires emergency replacement. County advised they approximate replacement cost for the project would be around \$52,000.00. The also stated there is approximately \$110K in Culvert funds available to the Township.

**Resolution 2025-07** for emergency culvert replacement with County Engineer as joint force account partner to complete work.

After discussions with County Engineer, Trustee Downard and Fiscal Office will review OPWC for future projects for Asphalt and Skim Coat to look for qualifications. Lisa stated past OPWC project grants she applied for had required an engineer. After reviewing some of the available programs her opinion was the LTIP or Small Government grants would possibly work best. The information was sent to Trustee Downard and Ashbaugh. Lisa also stated that applying in 2025 if successful would be funding available in 2026; so, road projects would need to look forward. The Board and Fiscal office will research further what OPWC funds may work for us. Trustee Downard stated the County Engineers office will assist in applying for OPWC grant funding.

#### **Further Business:**

Trustee Ashbaugh requested to receive a more detailed zoning report for the meetings. Similar to past reports. Lisa indicated she includes what is provided from the timesheet and suggested possibly the spreadsheet sent to the County monthly could be provided for the report. Trustee Moyer will discuss with Zoning Inspector to find an improved reporting method.
